SYDNEY FILM FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES CEMETERY OF SPLENDOUR

The 62nd Sydney Film Festival announces Apichatpong Weerasethakul's new film Cemetery of Splendour will screen at the Festival.

"The Festival is thrilled to announce another important film direct from Cannes will join the 2015 Festival line-up," said Festival Director Nashen Moodley. "Multi-award winning Thai filmmaker Weerasethakul's much anticipated Cemetery of Splendour is based on the true story of a strange and mysterious outbreak requiring 40 soldiers to be guarantined and hospitalised in northern Thailand. The film is transfixing, hypnotic and quietly overwhelming, a work of true beauty that demands to be seen in a cinema," he said.

Set in Weerasethakul's hometown of Khon Kaen, located in the northeast Thai region of Isan; Cemetery of Splendour, arrives at Sydney Film Festival from a rapturous reception in Cannes. Weerasethakul won the Palme d'Or in 2010 for Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives, and is counted as one of the most exciting voices in contemporary cinema.

Synopsis for this special screening:

CEMETERY OF SPLENDOUR

Straight from its rapturous reception in Cannes comes the latest film from Apichatpong Weerasethakul. One of the few directors to have won the Palme d'Or (Uncle Boonmee Who Can Recall His Past Lives, 2010), the Prix du Jury (Tropical Malady, 2004) and the Un Certain Regard prize (Blissfully Yours, 2002) at Cannes, Weerasethakul has established himself as one of the most exciting voices in contemporary cinema. Shot in Weerasethakul's home town of Khon Kaen, located in the northeast Thai region of Isan, Cemetery of Splendour centres around a mysterious rural clinic for soldiers suffering from troubled dreams, and the carers who look for ways to heal them. Transfixing, hypnotic and quietly overwhelming, this is a work of true beauty that demands to be seen in a cinema.

From Wednesday 3 June to Sunday 14 June 2015, the 62nd Sydney Film Festival offers Sydneysiders another exciting season of cinema amidst a whirlwind of premieres, red-carpet openings, panel















discussions, international guests and more. Each year the Festival's programming team curates 12 days of cinema sourced from world-famous film festivals, including Cannes, Sundance, Toronto and the Berlinale; as well as Australia's finest local productions.

Sydney Film Festival also presents an Official Competition of 12 films that vie for the Sydney Film Prize, a highly respected honour that awards a \$60,000 cash prize based on the decision of a jury of international and Australian filmmakers and industry professionals. Previous Sydney Film Prize winners are: Two Days, One Night (2014); Only God Forgives (2013); Alps (2012); A Separation (2011), which went on to win an Academy Award; Heartbeats (2010); and Bronson (2009).

The Festival takes place across greater Sydney: at the State Theatre, Event Cinemas George Street, Dendy Opera Quays, Dendy Newtown, Art Gallery of NSW, Hayden Orpheum Picture Palace Cremorne, Casula Powerhouse, the Festival Hub at Sydney Town Hall and SFF Outdoor Screen.
