





SYDNEY FILM FESTIVAL PRESENTS EUROPE'S WOMEN TO WATCH

The 63rd Sydney Film Festival (8-19 June), in partnership with European Film Promotion and Variety announces a new program of European Cinema, showcasing 10 new films by 10 of Europe's most promising women storytellers.

"European Cinema: 10 Women Filmmakers to Watch, is an important new Festival initiative that provides a platform for showcasing women's voices and storytelling," said Sydney Film Festival Director Nashen Moodley. "Audiences will discover a range of exciting and diverse films from these emerging filmmakers including stirring documentaries, sensitive character portraits, moving family dramas, and even a mermaid-vampire musical," he said.

The Festival will host five European filmmakers whose films are presented in the program: director and acclaimed Serbian actress Mirjana Karanović, Swedish visual artist and documentary filmmaker Sara Jordenö, Danish filmmaker Frederikke Aspöck whose films have screened at Cannes, one of Poland's most talented filmmakers Agnieszka Smoczynska, and actress and director Nicolette Krebitz from Berlin. Each are attending and will present their films to Festival audiences.

Renate Rose, Managing Director, European Film Promotion said, "With the support of our respective members, we are very happy to showcase an exciting variety of European women filmmakers, ranging from Serbia's acclaimed actress-turned-helmer Mirjana Karanović, who will present her directorial debut A Good Wife to Spain's experienced, award-winning Icíar Bollaín and her family drama The Olive Tree. And for EFP, this is also a wonderful occasion to expand our worldwide promotion activities to Australia, a very interesting market for European films."

ABOUT SYDNEY FILM FESTIVAL

From **Wednesday 8 June** to **Sunday 19 June 2016**, the 63rd Sydney Film Festival offers Sydneysiders another exciting season of cinema amidst a whirlwind of premieres, red-carpet openings, in-depth discussions, international guests and more. Each year the Festival's programming team curates 12 days of cinema sourced from world-famous film festivals, including Cannes, Sundance, Toronto and the Berlinale; as well as Australia's finest productions.

Sydney Film Festival also presents an Official Competition of 12 films that vie for the Sydney Film Prize, a highly respected honour that awards a \$60,000 cash prize based on the decision of a jury of international and Australian filmmakers and industry professionals. Previous Sydney Film Prize winners are: *Arabian Nights* (2015); *Two Days, One Night* (2014); *Only God Forgives* (2013); *Alps* (2012); *A Separation* (2011); *Heartbeats* (2010); *Bronson* (2009); and *Hunger* (2008).

The Festival takes place across greater Sydney: at the State Theatre, Event Cinemas George Street, Dendy Opera Quays, Dendy Newtown, Skyline Drive-In Blacktown, Art Gallery of NSW, Hayden Orpheum Picture Palace Cremorne, Casula Powerhouse, the Festival Hub at Sydney Town Hall and SFF Outdoor Screen.
