An action-packed program of free events: Sydney Film Festival Hub at Lower Town Hall

Due to popular demand the **Sydney Film Festival Hub at Lower Town Hall** returns for a second year offering the public a **free** venue to relax and mingle before or after screenings, see local and international acts, hear filmmaker talks and grab a drink at the Keystone Bar. The Festival Hub will be the only place to purchase \$10 discount tickets for selected screenings, as well as take part in a new **Film Club**, daily from 5pm to 6pm, to share your festival-going experiences and hear what's hot in Festival Land.

Awarding-winning European artist and filmmaker **Jeff Desom** will open the Festival Hub with a free video installation celebrating Alfred Hitchcock's 60-year-old masterpiece *Rear Window*. In a stunning 20-minute panoramic three-channel video projection shown daily, audiences can see out of the rear window of James Stewart's character's New York apartment and experience firsthand the intrigue and mystery of the classic thriller. Hear about Desom's inspiration for creating *Rear Window Loop* plus his acclaimed music video work on **Sunday 9 June from 6-7pm**.

The Festival Hub will play host to a number of fun live performances and parties inspired by cinema, including **True Lies**, an evening of stand-up comedy featuring a line-up of top Australian talent, a **VHS Party** dedicated to the trash and treasures of that vanishing format, **Cinema Burlesque**, a steamy showcase of cabaret and pole-dancing acts inspired by cult films, and the **Ultimate Film Trivia** night.

DJs will create the soundtrack for the Hub every evening until midnight, with nights dedicated to obscure, kitschy and wild film soundtracks, such as the **Freak Me Out Disco** with DJ Richard Kuipers.

"The Sydney Film Festival Hub is an attempt to rediscover the thrill we experienced when we first discovered that cinema spoke to us in a way we didn't think possible," says Hub Programmer Mathieu Ravier. "It gives that thrill a home, a place where it can circulate and energise and shed light, like an electrical current."

"The theme of the Hub program this year is **Cinema, Reconstructed**. I've invited artists, filmmakers, performers, academics and film buffs to remix, re-interpret and perform their own love letter to cinema. The results are unpredictable, entertaining and a lot of fun."

Screenings at the Festival Hub include timely and controversial documentary *TPB AFK – The Pirate Bay Away From Keyboard*, in which Hollywood lawyers take on the infamous file-sharing website, followed by a panel discussion on piracy and internet freedoms. Don't miss *Final Cut: Ladies & Gentlemen*, a collage film telling a new story using over 450 clips from films we know and love.

Directors in conversation at the Hub include 2013 Golden Bear winner Călin Peter Netzer (SFF Official Competition film **Child's Pose**) and acclaimed documentary filmmaker Joshua Oppenheimer (SFF Official Competition film **The Act of Killing**). We'll also look back on the Sydney Film Festival's 60-year history with **Juliea And The Directors**, in which journalist Julie Rigg chats with eight SFF programmers, from the founding artistic director David Donaldson (1954-57) to David Stratton (1966-83) to Nashen Moodley (2012 to now).

For nine nights from 6-14 June and with longer opening hours this year, the Festival Hub will burst at the seams with free talks and performances, screenings, video installations, a bookshop and of course, parties.

Artist Jeff Desom reconstructs the view out the rear window of James Stewart's character's New York apartment in Alfred Hitchcock's 60-year-old masterpiece, in a stunning 20-minute panoramic three-channel video projection.

<u>SCREENING: Cities on Speed: Bogota Change</u> and Q&A with director Andreas Dalsgaard Saturday 8 June, 12-2pm

Andreas Dalsgaard's documentary charts how the violent and corrupt Colombian capital was transformed into a peaceful model city using philosophies and strategies now exported to cities worldwide.

SCREENING: TPB AFK: The Pirate Bay Away from Keyboard + panel discussion

Sunday 9 June, 3-5pm

Hollywood lawyers take on the Swedish filesharing website in Simon Klose's revealing new documentary, introduced by producer Signe Byrge Sørensen and followed by a panel discussion on intellectual property and freedoms.

Josh Wheatley and puppet critic Harvey Feltztein host a screening party dedicated to the VHS and a popular cinema threatened by extinction. Bring your cued-up tapes and share your favourite scenes!
