



SOUTH WEST SYDNEY SCREENS BEST OF THE FEST

Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre and **Sydney Film Festival** have announced South Western Sydney audiences will have a curated program of eight sessions, including a package of three shorts, at Casula Powerhouse during the 65th Sydney Film Festival (6-17 June).

"The Festival will screen an excellent line-up of feature-length films, including a second chance to see the 2018 Opening Night selection, the side-splittingly funny New Zealand film *The Breaker Upperers* directed by Taika Waititi," said Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre Director Craig Donarski.

"You can also experience the award-winning drama *Wajib*, which is also competing in the Festival's Official Competition; a supernatural Young Adult thriller *The Changeover*, starring Timothy Spall and Lucy Lawless; the powerhouse drama *The Wife* and the charming romantic film *Puzzle*," he said.

"Two outstanding documentaries will also screen at Casula: *Pick of the Litter*, following the tricky process of training guide dogs for the blind, and *The Poetess*, about the first female finalist to compete in the Arabic equivalent of the *Idol* TV franchise, as well as three great shorts from the Festival's Screenability program," he said.

A FREE screening of three short films from the festival's Screenability program, funded by Create NSW, can be seen on Sunday 17 June at 4:00pm.
