Sydney Film Festival announces return of Screenability Program for fifth year

The 68th Sydney Film Festival today announced the return of Screenability for a fifth year. This program is an exciting platform for screen practitioners with disability, in partnership with Create NSW.

Curated by Guest Programmer Rebecca McCormack, Screenability Programming Assistant, six cutting edge works by filmmakers with disability will be showcased: feel good features **Best Summer Ever** and **Beautiful Minds**, and documentary **No Hay Camino – There is No Path**, as well as three Australian short films selected as part of the Screenability Filmmakers Fund from Create NSW: **Blockhead and Sparkles and The Flood of Tears**, **Deafying Gravity** and **We Have Me**.

For the fifth year, the Festival also maintains its inclusion policy, with audio described and open captioned screenings, and over 90 English-subtitled films.

Screenability at the Sydney Film Festival is part of a suite of initiatives designed to boost the participation of underrepresented groups in the screen industry. The focus of Screenability is to grow participation with a wide range of industry professionals, showcasing films by filmmakers with disability in a festival context.

Head of Screen NSW Grainne Brunsdon said, "Screenability will take over Sydney Film Festival screens across the city with the unique voices and insights of filmmakers with disability. I encourage you to check out the program that stars three homegrown short films from emerging filmmakers Samuel Martin, Danni Wright, Jacob Melamed, Emily Skerri-Rickert, Digby Webster, Lauren Orrell and their teams."
