Sydney Film Festival brings the world's best new films to Australia. The 68th festival is screening 200+ films in cinemas across Sydney 3–14 November. This year's festival is also streaming On Demand 12–21 November.

Sydney Film Festival endeavours to make its events a welcoming and inclusive experience for all audiences. All Sydney Film Festival venues are wheelchair accessible, with the exceptions of Cinemas 3 and 4 in Ritz Cinemas Randwick, which are not wheelchair accessible temporarily due to renovations. Sydney Film Festival is committed to ensuring the program is accessible to audiences online, including Closed Captions and Audio Descriptions for specific films.

Audio Description



Audio describers give verbal descriptions of all the visual elements of what is happening on the screen. This is done during natural pauses and gaps in the dialogue via a small earpiece, provided to audience members before the show. Customers must book the service in advance online or over the phone and pick up their FM headset on arrival. Open Captioning is a text display of all the words and sounds heard on screen. Foreign language films are also subtitled in English, though this does not include full open captioning.
