CELEBRATING WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY: SYDNEY FILM FESTIVAL ANNOUNCES SHORTLIST FOR SUSTAINABLE FUTURE AWARD

This World Environment Day, June 5, the 70th Sydney Film Festival celebrates 15 films shortlisted for the Sustainable Future Award. All films will screen at the Festival from 7-18 June and in recognition of World Environment Day, and the urgent messages within each of these remarkable films, SFF is offering \$10 tickets to these sessions for today only (9am to 9pm, Monday 5 June).

Established in 2021, the Sustainable Future Award offers a cash prize to a narrative or documentary film of any length that deepens our knowledge and awareness of the impact of the global climate emergency. Four documentaries and 11 shorts have been shortlisted for this year's award.

In 2023, the Sustainable Future Award has increased from \$10,000 to \$40,000, leading the world in offering the largest cash prize for a film tackling climate change and sustainability.

The feature-length films nominated for the 2023 Sustainable Future Award are all documentaries: from Australia, *Climate Changers* and *Rachel's Farm*, and from overseas, *Against the Tide* and *Paradise*.

A series of 11 climate and environment orientated shorts, presented in a partnership between Sydney Film Festival, ABC and the Australian Museum, will also all individually compete for the coveted award, and screen as a package together. These shorts are made from motivated and talented emerging filmmakers, all taking part in an ABC Factual and Doc Society Initiative supported by Screen Territory, VicScreen, Screen Tasmania, Screen Queensland and Screenwest.

"As we celebrate World Environment Day on June 5th, Sydney Film Festival remains committed to using the medium of film to shed light on pressing environmental issues," said **Sydney Film Festival Director Nashen Moodley**. "The Sustainable Future Award signifies our dedication to supporting filmmakers who strive to make a difference, inspiring audiences and catalysing positive action. We are excited to showcase these remarkable films and look forward to crowning the winner at the Festival's Closing Night – June 18."

ABC's Acting Head of Factual and Culture Richard Huddleston said, "This timely initiative reflects the ABC's ongoing commitment to supporting emerging filmmakers. It is a strong example of what can happen when we join forces with state agencies and vital industry organisations like Doc Society. Together, we wish all of our film makers the best of luck"







Rachel Ward, Director of *Rachel's Farm* said "This very generous prize gives the filmmakers an opportunity to affect the reach and distribution of their film with some hugely valuable impact funding."

Tim Flannery, environmentalist and subject of *Climate Changers* said, "Without climate leaders, we will lose the world that has nurtured us."

All films will screen in-cinema at the 70th Sydney Film Festival, with the winner of the Sustainable Future Award to be revealed at the Festival's Closing Night Gala, on Sunday, June 18.
