


Directed by Andrew Haigh | UK English | 105 mins | MA 15+

As the relationship unearths old memories, Adam revisits what was his childhood home before his parents (Clare Foy and Jamie Bell) died 30 years before. Meanwhile there are reminders of the war in Ukraine and the climate crisis. Against his will, Holappa is dragged to a karaoke night, where he meets Ansa and there's a romantic spark. Obstacles get in their way but still these two remain hopeful. With beautiful performances by Pöysti and Vatanen, Fallen Leaves is a vital and welcome addition to Kaurismäki's working-class trilogy and his mastery remains undiminished here. Shadowed by war, economic disparity and turmoil, his message is to still look

Tamuki and his daughter Hama live in the serene woods, outside of Tokyo. They live their lives connected to, and in reverence to. the nature around them. But their serenity soon is viewed as a commodity, when their area becomes a target for corporations looking to find areas to offer "escapes to nature" that will disrupt the delicate ecological balance. With ever growing tension, this timely drama is not to be missed.

Hüller plays Sandra, a successful German writer who has spent the last year living with her French husband Samuel (Samuel Theis) and 11-year-old son Daniel (Milo Machado Graner) in a chalet in the idyllic French Alps. When Samuel is found lying dead in the snow by Daniel. The police investigate and Sandra is put on trial for murder, with her son's testimony crucial to the outcome. As concerned with ideas around sexuality, art and marriage as with the twists and turns of the investigation and trial, its a searingly intelligent film that lingers in the mind long after the closing credits. Winner of two Golden Globes.

When a passionate young couple, Banel (Khady Mane) and Adama (Mamadou Diallo), begin to defy societal expectation, the locals begin to correlate their behaviour and the drought befalling their region. Jonathan Glazer (Under the Skin, Sexy Beast) delivers a chilling masterpiece unlike any other WWII film, as the camera cooly spies on the daily mechanics of a German family living next door to Auschwitz.

Winner of the Grand Prix Cannes 2023, this haunting and unique film, follows a seemingly everyday family mundanely crafting a dream home. A home that shares a wall with Auschwitz during WWII where patriarch Rudolf Höss (Christian Friedel) methodically works, and the atrocities within earshot are ignored by the family (including Hoss' wife, played by the award-winning Sandra Hüller), Generating a haunting mood by what is unseen rather than seen, Glazer crafts a scalpel sharp examination of how banal evil can be, that keeps audiences tight in its atmospheric grip. Wim Wenders' Japan-set charmer is a deeply moving and poetic reflection on the beauty to be found in the everyday.

Hirayama (Koji Yakusho, Shall We Dance?, Babel) is a meticulous man of routine. Each day he awakes, grooms himself, waters his plants and looks up at the sky with a smile as he leaves home. And then he sets to his work as a toilet cleaner in Shibuya. Tokyo. In his car, he listens to classic rock tunes on cassettes - the music of The Velvet Underground, The Kinks, Prince and Van Morrison erving as the soundtrack to his day. The appearance of a young woman at his doorstep leads to revelations about Hirayama's past. Filled with surprising delight, Perfect Days is a gentle, inspirational ode to simple but profound pleasures.
