Jonathan Glazer (Under the Skin, Sexv Beast) delivers a chilling masterpiece unlike any other WWII film, as the camera cooly spies on the daily mechanics of a German family living next door to Auschwitz.

Winner of the Grand Prix Cannes 2023. this haunting and unique film, follows a seemingly everyday family mundanely crafting a dream home. A home that shares a wall with Auschwitz during WWII where patriarch Rudolf Höss (Christian Friedel) methodically works. and the atrocities within earshot are ignored by the family (including Hoss' wife, played by the award-winning Sandra Hüller). Generating a haunting mood by what is unseen rather than seen, Glazer crafts a scalpel sharp examination of how banal evil can be. that keeps audiences tight in its atmospheric grip. Nominated for three Golden Globes including Best Motion Picture, Drama
