



Over their divergent lives, they reconnect again and again around the mountain where they met. A potent exploration of friendship, resilience, and realisation, this is an unforgettable film intimately felt, and epically filmed in magnificent locations.

Jonathan Glazer (Under the Skin, Sexy Beast) delivers a chilling masterpiece unlike any other WWII film, as the camera cooly spies on the daily mechanics of a German family living next door to Auschwitz

From acclaimed studio A24, this haunting and unique film, follows a seemingly everyday family mundanely crafting a dream home. A home that shares a wall with Auschwitz in WWII, where patriarch Rudolf Höss (Christian Friedel) methodically works, and the atrocities within earshot are ignored by the family. Generating a haunting mood by what is unseen rather than seen, Glazer crafts a scalpel sharp examination of how banal evil can be, that keeps audiences tight in its atmospheric grip.

Ansa (Alma Pöysti) works at badly paid supermarket job, taking home expired sandwiches to eat. Holappa (Jussi Vatanen) is a metalworker. labouring each day in a hazardous iob that he is sure will kill him, and drinking day and night. Meanwhile there are reminders of the war in Ukraine and the climate crisis. Against his will, Holappa is dragged to a karaoke night, where he meets Ansa and there's a romantic spark. Obstacles get in their way but still these two remain hopeful. With beautiful performances by Pöysti and Vatanen, Fallen Leaves is a vital and welcome addition to Kaurismäki's working-class trilogy and his mastery remains undiminished here. Shadowed by war, economic disparity and turmoil, his message is to still look for love.

Wim Wenders' Japan-set charmer is a deeply moving and poetic reflection on the beauty to be found in the everyday.

Hirayama (Koji Yakusho, Shall We Dance?, Babel) is a meticulous man of routine. Each day he awakes, grooms himself, waters his plants and looks up at the sky with a smile as he leaves home. And then he sets to his work as a toilet cleaner in Shibuya, Tokyo. In his car, he listens to classic rock tunes on cassettes - the music of The Velvet Underground, The Kinks, Prince and Van Morrison erving as the soundtrack to his day. The appearance of a young woman at his doorstep leads to revelations about Hirayama's past. Filled with surprising delight, Perfect Days is a gentle, inspirational ode to simple but profound pleasures.
